A quick walk round round the centre

We save cats, dingoes and dogs.

We have a separate area for cats which is divided up into several rooms: Cat Isolation, Mums and Bubs, Kittens, Teens, Junior Adults and Seniors.

For the Dogs we have large yards with cabins, the pups are out in yards too but sleep in crates at night in the main building.

Most of the dingoes have their own yards similar to the dogs and some sleep inside at night. Although we have 20 dingoes only very few are up for adoption.

Cat of the Week

We would like to introduce you to the H-team of kittens, particularly Haidee. This litter arrived in April from Tullymorgan, their mother had been hit by a car and died leaving 7 kittens behind with no one to look after them. They were only 3-4 weeks old, out came the bottles, soft food introduced and they all survived. We already had an orphan about the same age who was pleased to have some friends to play with. They are mainly black, full of personality, friendly and very playful due to the care given. They have had their vet work done and are ready for their forever homes.



Dog of the Week

Danika arrived in a box with her sister, Danae, and two brothers, Dane and Dante. They were about 6 weeks of age and have grown into a very affectionate, curious and confident puppies. Danika loves to go on adventures on lead. She loves exploring the training yard with its tunnels, paddling pool, toys, boxes and platforms, it is the best fun ever. All four have similar

pretty easy going temperaments and love people, cuddles and any attention coming their way. Danika is particularly people oriented and slightly more mellow than her siblings. Their breed is a mystery but we think they have some Huntaway in them or something similar. They'll be on the medium to maybe large side of the scale.

Our News Snippets

This year we have rescued 153 cats, dogs and dingoes of which 104 animals have found loving homes. For a small no kill rural adoption centre this is huge.

Due to this influx of animals, we are currently trying to find the money to build a new dog yard to give the pups a place to run and play as they are growing out of their puppy pens.



Also this influx has caused our expenses to go through the roof. The main ones are vet costs, food and parasite control.

Rosie's Story

You might remember the Maremmas that were dumped at Urunga Golf Course in April last year. The interesting thing about this was that it was not the first time they were dumped. In February last year we received a call to say that someone had found three Maremma pups near Coramba Road on the out skirts of Coffs Harbour. They had rung other rescues without success, so we went to pick them up. We got them back to Happy Paws Haven and



checked them for a chip, nothing found. We then tried to find their owner. In the mean time we chipped them, had them vet checked and vaccinated them. There was Parvo around at that time, not at Happy Paws Haven but in the Clarence Valley and Coffs Coast. Also we had Rosie's eye

checked as it was slightly abnormal. We received a call from a man who said he owned them and could prove it. He came and picked them up, we felt things were not quite as they should be but we had to give them to him.

When the Maremmas at Urunga were trapped in April they went to the pound. We informed the ranger of our history and yes we found of the four Maremma's dumped at Urunga two were chipped with my chip. We took them from the pound under a duty of care until the owner had been contacted. Interestingly he said he did not want them back and that he had rehomed them to someone in Queensland denying any knowledge.



Moving forward we gained custody and got all the necessary vet work done, monitoring Rosie's eye along the way. It started to swell and we were worried it might explode so made the decision to have it taken. Rosie was the model patient. It healed quickly and Rosie was back playing with her siblings.

Just recently, a loyal supporter of Happy Paws Haven who had adopted from us before, contacted us wanting to adopt a dog. She was on property, had horses, sheep, a pig and chickens etc. She needed a dog that would cope with an array of animals including the resident cat. She had had a Maremma before who had passed recently but she said she was not sure whether she wanted another. So we spent the time introducing her to all our dogs, spending time with those who seem to fit the bill. For some reason Rosie kept being the one that connected best so won the day going with Hillary to her lovely property. We were not sure how she would react to the chickens, horses, sheep and the pig. We thought she would be ok with the cat as she had shown no interest here.
